### WIRELESS INTERNET ACCESS

The Bonneville Joint School District No. 93 Board of Trustees supports wireless internet access as a means of providing additional opportunities for research, collaboration, and communication that is directly related to school assignments and projects. The Superintendent/designee is directed to develop and implement procedures that, to the extent possible, protect students from access to inappropriate materials over the wireless connection and that support the acquisition of skills to analyze and evaluate resources.

# **Technical Support**

The District Technology Department <u>will not</u> provide technical support for hardware or software on personal wireless devices.

# **Limitation of Liability**

- 1. Bonneville Joint School District No. 93 makes no guarantee that the functions or the services provided by the wireless network system will be without defect.
- 2. The District will not be responsible for any damages suffered, including but not limited to:
  - a. loss of data.
  - b. interruptions of service,
  - c. accuracy or quality of information obtained through or stored on the system, or
  - d. any financial obligations arising through the unauthorized use of the system.

#### **Violations**

- 1. Violation of the provisions of this policy shall result in disciplinary action, including but not limited to:
  - a. confiscation of the device by an administrator or staff member,
  - b. loss of the privilege of bringing the device onto school property,
  - c. required restitution for any damage to the network caused by hacking,
  - d. detention,
  - e. suspension,
  - f. expulsion, or
  - g. termination from employment.
- 2. Where appropriate, law enforcement authorities may be contacted.

## **DEFINITION**

**Wireless Devices** any piece of equipment that is able to connect to the internet through the District's wireless network (cell phones, laptops, I-phones, PDAs, etc.).
