Items for Discussion

Facilities Planning

High School Renovations Presentation - NBW and VCBO Architects

Chairman Jenkins invited Kevin Bodily, Whitney Ward and Brian Peterson to present on HS renovations. Ms. Ward explained that the architects had toured both high schools to gather ideas and pros and cons of each school and held brainstorming BlueSky meetings with the District committee. The purpose of the renovations is to create parity between the district's older high schools and the new Thunder Ridge HS. The renovation project is divided into phases that will be accomplished in the next twelve years. These renovations will increase the pride of the each school by replacing and upgrading science classrooms to current standards, and bringing the capacity of each school to 1,600 students. Phase 1 for both schools would include an inviting entry with a secure and single access point, new administration office suite, and eight new science classrooms and labs, creating an additional 33,000 square foot new construction space. Both schools could be renovated during the same 18 month period, without interrupting student learning during the school day. Cost assumptions are \$300/SF for new construction, \$200/SF for renovation, \$100/SF for upgrades and \$400/SF to add an auditorium to Bonneville HS.

2. Bond Discussion – Guy Wangsgard, Scott Woolstenhulme

Chairman Jenkins invited Scott Woolstenhulme to discuss bonding for HS renovations. He discussed how renovations would affect capacity, special education programs, use of modular trailer classrooms, boundary changes, etc. The architects explained that working alongside the general contractor is very helpful as pricing is concerned. Working during in the summer months is very important for project planning and meeting opening schedules.
