RELATIONSHIP ABUSE PREVENTION AND RESPONSE

The Board of Trustees endeavor to take steps to prevent and/or respond to known instances of relationship abuse. Such conduct by students, or third parties, is strictly prohibited and <u>shall not</u> be tolerated on any District premises, or at any District sponsored activity, regardless of location.

Guidelines

- 1. Students whose behavior is found to be in violation of this policy will be subject to discipline, up to and including expulsion.
- 2. Third parties whose behavior is found to be in violation of this policy shall be subject to appropriate sanctions as determined and imposed by the Superintendent/ designee or Board of Trustees.
- 3. Students or third parties may be referred to law enforcement officials.

DEFINITIONS

On any District premises or at any District sponsored activity, regardless of location: shall include, but not be limited to buildings, facilities, and grounds on the District's campuses, school buses, District parking areas; and the location of any District or school sponsored activity. This includes instances in which the conduct occurs off the District premises, but impacts a District related activity.

Relationship Abuse: includes the intentional use of physical, sexual, verbal, or emotional abuse or violence by a person to harm, threaten, intimidate, or control another person in a current or past relationship.

Sexual Assault: includes sexual violence, sexual abuse, sexual stalking, and rape.
