## RELATIONS WITH THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AND CHILD PROTECTIVE AGENCIES

The primary responsibility for maintaining proper order and conduct in the Bonneville Joint School District No. 93 schools is that of the District administration and staff. Law enforcement or child protective agencies shall be called upon for assistance when there is substantial threat to the health and safety of students or others. District administration and/or staff members shall communicate information regarding major violations of the law to appropriate law enforcement or child protection agencies.

## **Guidelines**

- 1. District administration and staff shall be responsible for holding students accountable for infractions relating to violations of board policy, *Code of Student Conduct* or school rules, which may include minor violations of the law occurring during school hours, at school sponsored activities, or on District premises.
- 2. In the case of bomb threats, mass demonstrations with threat of violence, individual threats of substantial bodily harm, trafficking in prohibited drugs, or the scheduling of events where large crowds may be difficult to handle, the appropriate law enforcement agency shall be called upon for assistance.
- 3. The District shall strive to develop and maintain cooperative working relationships with the law enforcement and child protective agencies.
- 4. Procedures for cooperation between law enforcement, child protective, and school authorities shall be established.
- 5. Such procedures shall be made available to all District staff and periodically revised.

## **DEFINITION**

**Staff:** includes all administrators, certificated and classified personnel.
